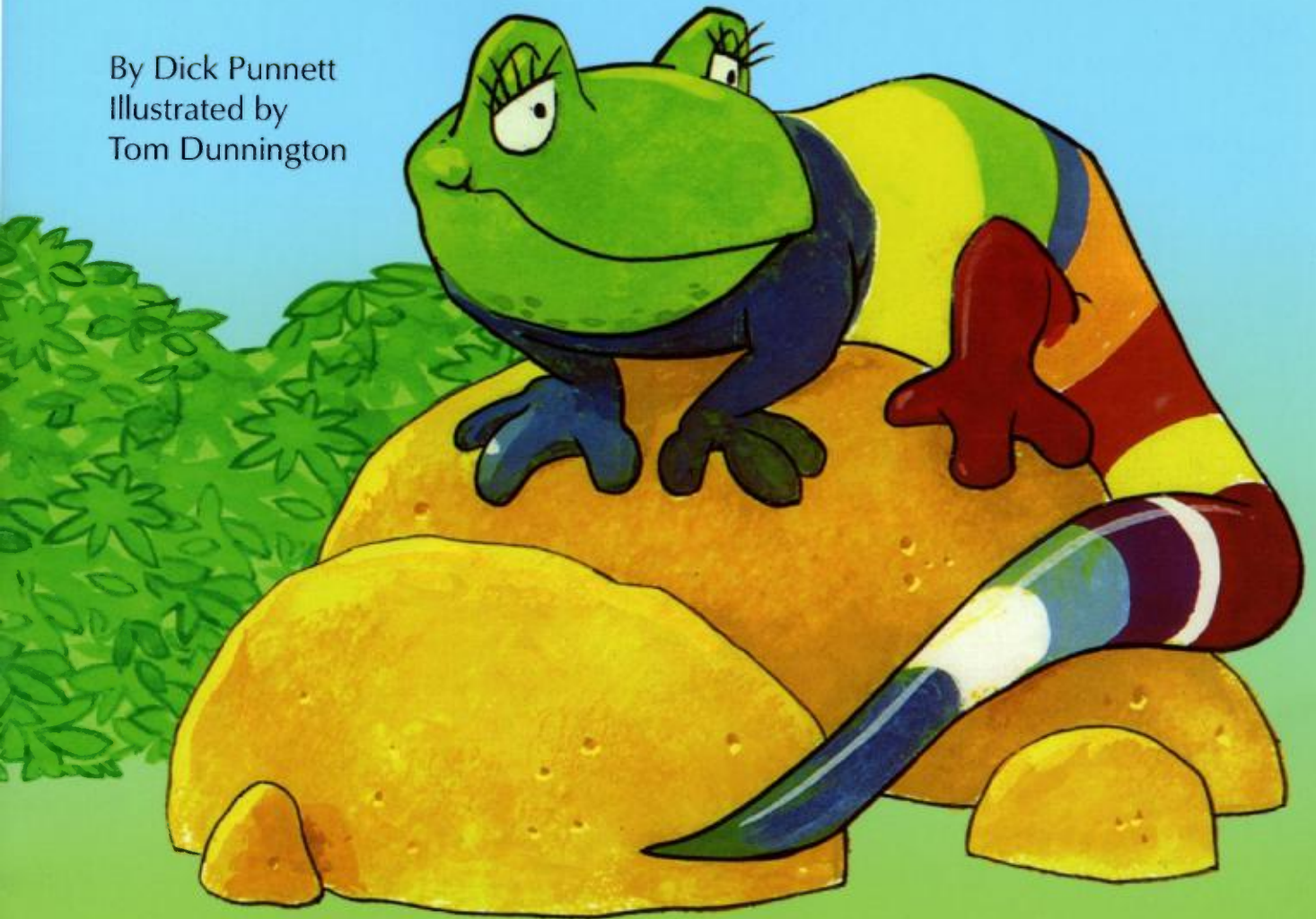

Our story has a speaking part.

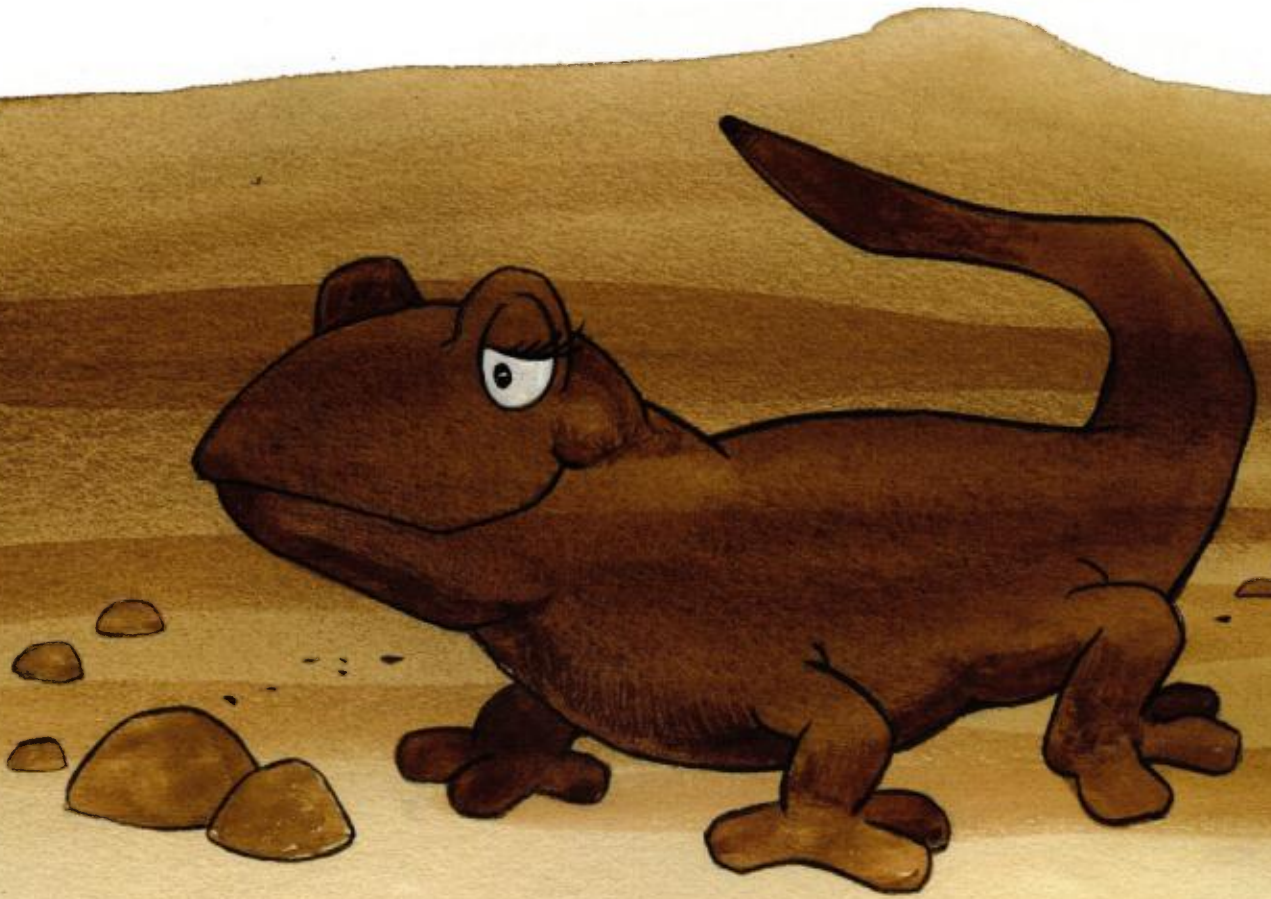
When you see the dots . . .
